SPORTS AND WELLBEING


No matter what your skill level, there are sport and recreational activities on and off campus for you to try, including free yoga and discounted social sport.

ACCOMMODATION

SELWYN STREET STUDIOS

Close to campus and the beach, enjoy self-catered living in your own fully furnished studio room complete with ensuite bathroom, mini fridge and free WiFi. Each floor has a shared kitchenette and social space with great views over Waikareao Estuary. Communal kitchen, dining and (free) laundry facilities are on the basement level. Additionally, there is a free weekly supermarket shuttle.

Three studios are designed for students with accessibility needs. With staff rostered on duty every day and one Residential Leader (RL) to every 23 students, there is always someone around to provide help and guidance.





DURHAM MEWS APARTMENTS

Durham Mews is located next to the campus. The accommodation offers six three-bedroom flats, each with a shared kitchen, living room, bathroom and laundry.

TRANSPORT

In Tauranga, there is a range of local bus routes and discounts, making your journey to campus easy and affordable.

LOCAL BUSES

Get a Bee Card and register it with your tertiary concession to receive cheaper fares.

CYCLING TO CAMPUS

Bike racks are available around campus, with secure swipe card storage for bikes and scooters.

With showers, lockers, kitchen facilities, a café and plenty of chill-out spaces, the Tauranga campus is set up for students to stay all day and cycle or take the bus home.

KAIMAI SHUTTLE

A free shuttle service runs between Hamilton and Tauranga campuses for students who need to travel from one to the other for classes, research supervision, or matters related to their study. If you are keen on a subject that's only available at the Hamilton campus,

you may be able to work it into your timetable and use the shuttle to commute.

The shuttle travels Monday to Friday, four times a day during the teaching weeks of A and B trimesters, and a reduced service during the teaching periods of C, G and H. Cut down on driving and use the free WiFi to get study done on the journey. The service is first in first served.



WSU Tauranga has partnerships with organisations such as Good Neighbour, Burgerfuel, Red Bull, Astrolabe, and Miss Gee's.






NGĀ TAUWĀHI WHERE WE ARE ?

The timings are estimates for travel from the Tauranga Campus



Our Tauranga campus is perfectly placed for students who want to explore life on or in the water with our Marine Science major in a Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Science (Technology). We recommend students combine a Marine Science major with an Aquaculture or Environmental Sciences minor.

Exclusive to Tauranga, Marine Science can be taken as major or minor subject, or you may opt for a double major to enhance your career pathway opportunities.

Close to growing marine-based industries, coastal communities and New Zealand's busiest port, our Tauranga campus boasts a modern learning environment and state-of-the-art aquatic and chemistry laboratories, just minutes from the Tauranga Harbour.

Immerse yourself in a lifestyle that complements your passion for the environment. With some of the best surf beaches, fishing and dive spots and hiking/biking trails right on your doorstep, expect a unique experience when you study Science in Tauranga.





MARINE SCIENCE

This exciting new subject covers the science of marine systems, including ecology, physical processes, ecosystem restoration and conservation

Graduates will be prepared for roles in marine and coastal management, and the sustainable development of new and emerging marine industries, with enhanced numeracy skills and a stronger awareness of the interplay between science and mātauranga Māori. Plus, if you are interested in marine birds, sharks and whales, this is the subject for you.

Marine Science can also be studied in the Graduate Certificate and Graduate Diploma in Science.

RECOMMENDED MINORS

Aquaculture

Learn to identify opportunities, issues and solutions relevant to the aquaculture industry and 'Blue Economy', including the need to create diverse aquaculture projects that are both sustainable and profitable.

Study Aquaculture to understand and apply your knowledge of marine ecology, marine biosecurity and legislation relating to sustainable aquaculture of fish, invertebrates and algae.

Environmental Sciences

Environmental Sciences is about understanding and managing human impacts on our land, biodiversity, freshwater, oceans, atmosphere and climate while providing the food, water, energy, and mineral resource needs that are critical to our survival

At Waikato we take a strong interdisciplinary approach so you will gain skills in applying the biological, chemical and earth sciences to understand and manage the impacts of human activities on the environment.

Bachelor of Science - Aquaculture, Philosophy

"I'm an international student from Indonesia. I had just finished my high school before Covid-19 hit and everything was brought online. I then started the Foundation Course in Waikato College.

I chose to study a Bachelor of Science with Aquaculture because I wanted to learn marine biology, but also wanted to learn how to better apply it in a business and industry sense.

What I like the most about the Tauranga campus is the community of people. Since we have fewer students compared to Hamilton, it has allowed me to get to know more people better and more in depth."

WORK-INTEGRATED LEARNING

A compulsory component of all University of Waikato undergraduate degrees, work-integrated learning creates a link between academic learning and the practical applications of this learning in a workplace. Students spend time in an organisation undertaking genuine tasks or working on a specified project.



LORENA KUCHENBECKER

Bachelor of Social Sciences - Environmental Planning, Geography

Lorena completed a work-integrated learning experience at Tauranga City Council where she researched international policies on green roofs and provided a recommendation report on how the Council could best implement this initiative in Tauranga.

"Being a practical learner, the hands-on experience during my work-integrated learning paper was very valuable. Working for a council and being welcomed as a student employee provided meaningful insights and a better understanding of the working world. I was encouraged by my supervisor to talk to different people and different teams, which helped me understand the range of roles that are out there in the areas I'm interested in. Through this, I gained many networking opportunities and connections that helped me learn more about what I can do in this field once I graduate, and helped me gain the summer internship I have now at the Council."



















JUMP START

Jump Start is a 4-week summer programme for students new to the University and studying for an undergraduate degree.

Jump Start is beneficial for students with lower NCEA credits in core areas, those who have been out of study for a while, and anyone who wants to get a head start in their study, gain confidence or would benefit from easing their way into University. Our stats show that students who do a Jump Start paper do better academically.

Students in Tauranga can take Writing for Academic Success (WRITE100) or Pre-Law (LEGAL101) and in most cases this paper can be credited to their degree.

Classes run Monday to Friday and students attend study skills workshops, become familiar with university systems, meet key teaching and support staff and make new friends, all before the start of the trimester

A free shuttle runs between the Tauranga and Hamilton campuses if you are Tauranga based and wanting to do one of the Hamilton Jump Start papers

ENGINEERING

Now, more than ever, the world needs more creative engineers who can take what they know and put that into practice. At Waikato, that's what we do best.

Students can study the first year of their engineering degree in Tauranga and move to Hamilton for years 2 and 3, with the option of returning to Tauranga in year 4 for a number of the engineering majors. A state-of-the-art engineering laboratory, situated next to the campus, contains specialist equipment that allows for collaborative learning and research between our students and academic staff

All eight of our engineering programmes are internationally accredited by Engineering New Zealand (formerly IPENZ) on behalf

of international accreditation body, the Washington Accord. This means that the degree is internationally recognised and will make it possible for engineering graduates to work just about anywhere in the world.

The software engineering degree programme has dual accreditation with both Engineering NZ on behalf of international accreditation body, the Washington Accord and the Australian Computer Society on behalf of the international accreditation body, the Seoul Accord.

Te Piringa Faculty of Law is founded on the core principles of professionalism, biculturalism, and the study of law in context.

Studying law at Waikato ensures that students are firmly grounded in the core legal subjects (together with company law, dispute resolution, and tikanga Māori) that provide the building blocks for thinking like a lawyer.

All four years of the Bachelor of Laws can be studied in Tauranga. The classes are small and are typically offered in seminar-style discussions, with some lectures presented via video conference from Hamilton. Students can also opt to finish their studies after two years and gain a Diploma in Law (DipLaw).

The BSc(Tech) degree also includes 10 weeks of work placement.

Broaden your knowledge base with a Science minor. Aquaculture and Environmental Science are available at the Tauranga campus as minor subjects and are highly recommended for students interested in Marine Science.

DIPLOMA IN TE TOHU PAETAHI

The first intensive te reo Māori programme of its kind, Te Tohu Paetahi (TTP) has paved the way for the revitalisation of te reo Māori for more than 30 years.

The focus of the programme is to provide you with a unique Māori language immersion pathway, with the goal of gaining fluency, whatever your starting level.

Learn in a safe and supportive environment that's culturally rich in context, with each day beginning and ending with a karakia. Experience marae noho (marae stays), hākinakina (sports) and kapa haka that provide opportunities to develop your reo and the whānaungatanga (relationships) with your classmates.

You can attain a Diploma in Te Tohu Paetahi and keep it as a standalone qualification, or study it before or after your undergraduate or postgraduate degree. You can also opt to credit the diploma towards a Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Social Sciences, or credit some papers towards electives in other degrees.
